We Want Your.....Trash!

Our customers enjoy weekly trash removal, monthly recycling, and yard waste removal. With advance notice, we remove large items and additional trash with no additional fees. Customers also have free access to the yard waste site. The cost for services is only \$49 per quarter and includes your choice of a 64 gallon tote OR a 96 gallon tote plus one recycle tote.

You can sign up for sanitation services by stopping into township hall, the contract is also available on our website. Once we've received a completed contract services will begin on the next scheduled day for your area.

- Tote Placement—lid toward road—handle toward house
- **Extra Trash** will be picked up with advance notice occasionally. Residents who regularly have extra trash should obtain an additional tote for \$3.00 per quarter.
- Christmas Tree Pick Up will be on your garbage day the week of January 6 for sanitation customers only.

Muskegon Charter Township employees are adopting Christian Care Nursing Home residents this year for Christmas.


If you'd like to help—tags are available on the tree at township hall and both fire stations.

Winter Reminders

- Snow plows forcefully throw snow and ice chunks several feet. Make sure your mailbox is securely fastened to the post. It must be able to withstand the force of the snow from the plows.
- Do not put snow from your driveway in the road or push across the street.
- Cars parked next to the road in unpaved road right-ofways may be damaged by debris thrown off the plow.
 Cars should be parked in driveways.
- Keep sanitation containers back from edge of road to avoid damage from the force of the snow from the plows.
- DPW will not replace fiberglass marker poles that are damaged by plowing.

Call the non-emergency number for Central Dispatch, 231-722-3524, to report water main breaks or sewer problems after normal working hours.

Direct Debit Bill Pay

Muskegon Township now offers paperless billing for Sanitation and Sewer customers who choose to receive their quarterly bills via email.

Direct Debit Bill Pay is available for your Sewer, Sanitation and Tax bills. Direct debit payments allow your bill to be paid automatically from your checking or savings account via an Automated Clearing House (ACH) transaction.

Sewer and Sanitation bills will be debited from your account on the due date. For Tax bills, you can specify to have your Summer Tax bill paid on the first Friday of July or the first Friday of September. Winter taxes can be paid on the first Friday in December, the last business day in December or the first Friday in February.

You can discontinue direct debit payments at any time with written notice to the Township Treasurer.

*No sanitation service. Collection will be one day later than normal after the holiday.
